The main attraction of this year's meeting was a talk by our old friend Allan Mechen who has quite a repertoire of subjects associated with carving and this time it was Staining, Bleaching and Finishing. We all like to get our work as smooth as possible but the method we use to actually finish it can be the icing on the cake and Allan showed us a number of ways of colouring from ebonizing at one end of the scale to bleaching at the other. Thanks Allan for once again sharing your knowledge with your fellow club members.

Something else Allan has done for the club is to carve the Member's Cup and it is at the Spring meeting that we award it to the member who has put in that little extra effort on behalf of the club over the previous year. So for 2024/25 the committee decided to award it to Mark Baker who has provided games at social events, been first-aid trained for the club, fixed broken marquee poles and done several other good deeds over the course of the year.

Another fixture of our social meetings is the sale of wood, tools and books which adds a little to our coffers and on this occasion we also had a chocolate cake and Sharon's apple cake to go with our refreshments.
